## The Carthage Red Men/Lady Reds

Carthage men's athletic teams have carried the nickname "Red Men" since the 1920s. Referring to the color of their uniforms, the Red Men had no association with Native American imagery in those years, nor is there any today.

With the rise of women's intercollegiate athletics in the late twentieth century, the teams chose the nickname "Lady Reds" in the 1980s. Again, that name referred to Carthage athletic colors.

Flame imagery characterizes both academic and athletic identity at Carthage. The crest of the College features a torch and flame, and the highest award conferred by the College is the "Carthage Flame." The athletic logotypes for the Red Men and the Lady Reds feature a stylized flame symbolizing heat, fire, and commitment.

## 2008 Carthage Men's Golf Review/ 2009 Outlook

### ***2008 Season Review***

The 2008 Carthage College men's golf team (79-19) saw its two-year streak of winning the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin Men's Golf Championship come to an end. Illinois Wesleyan University won the 2008 league championship with a 294-296-312-307-1209 team score, 17 strokes ahead of second-place Carthage at 304-287-319-316-1226. Wheaton College (Ill.) was third at 305-305-317-317-1244, followed by Millikin University fourth at 303-298-332-321-1254, North Central College fifth at 326-308-331-324-1289, Elmhurst College sixth at 319-326-334-322-1301, North Park University seventh at 312-318-336-337-1303 and Augustana College (Ill.) eighth at 324-317-356-334-1331. The first two rounds were played on April 18-19 at the Bolingbrook Golf Course in Bolingbrook, Ill. Rounds three and four were played on May 2-3 at the Cantigny Golf Course in Wheaton, Ill.

The format for the CCIW Men's Golf Championship was changed in 2007. Instead of the previous 36-hole championship played at the Elks Country Club in Pontiac, Ill., the championship was expanded to a four-day, 72-hole event and played on two separate weekends on two courses. In 2007, Carthage received the league's first-ever automatic qualifier to the NCAA Division III Men's Golf Championship.

While Carthage missed out on winning the CCIW's automatic team qualifier, Tyler Wollberg (Sr., Mundelein, Ill., team-leading 73.5 final season average) was one of five individuals selected to play at the 2008 NCAA Division III Men's Golf Championship at the Chateau Elon Resort in Braselton, Ga. Wollberg finished in a four-way tie for 15th place with a 76-73-77-74-300, 15 strokes behind the leader, St. John Fisher's Scott Harris Jr., at 68-71-71-75-285. With his top-15 finish, Wollberg earned Golf Coaches Association of America/PING second-team All-American honors.

At the CCIW championship, Tyler Wollberg shared the lead at 74-69-75-76-294, but Illinois Wesleyan's Chris Green won a four-hole, sudden-death playoff to claim medalist honors. Wollberg earned All-CCIW honors, along with teammate Matt Carr (Sr., Galesburg, Ill., 76.9 season average), who finished fifth at 74-70-81-78-303. Dave Mikolaitis (graduated-senior, Algonquin, Ill./Woodstock-Marian Central Catholic, 80.3) was 13th at 78-74-82-81-315, Anthony Milano (Jr., Geneva, Ill., 80.1) tied for 14th at 78-74-83-81-316, and Tim Gannon (Sr., Darien, Ill./Lombard-Montini Catholic, 78.5) finished 19th with an 80-76-81-82-319.

Carthage played extremely well going into the CCIW championship, winning six-of-11 tournaments and finishing second or third in three others.

The Red Men won the Sept. 19 Carthage "Buffalo Wild Wings Fall Classic," the Sept. 29-30 Wisconsin Lutheran Fall Invitational, the March 28-29 Knox College "Prairie Fire Classic," the April 20-21 Carroll College (Wis.) Invitational, the April 22 Carthage Spring Invitational and the April 26 Lawrence University "Viking Invitational." Tyler Wollberg won a school-record four tournaments, while finishing second four times, fourth once and fifth once. Tim Gannon won two tournaments, while Matt Carr had six top-five finishes.

### **2009 Season Preview**

Carthage coach Dave Roehl (459-143-9, 6 years) returns 15-of-16 letterwinners and four of his top-five scorers, including Golf Coaches Association of America All-American Tyler Wollberg, All-CCIW honoree Matt Carr, Anthony Milano (tied for 14th at the CCIW championship and Tim Gannon (tied for 19th).

Other returnees Jared Hallam (Sr., Galesburg, Ill., 78.3 season average) Bobby O'Neill (So., Mokena, Ill./Frankfort—Lincoln-Way East, 80.9), Dan Dembkowski (Sr., Mount Prospect, Ill./Arlington Heights-Hersey, 82.5), Andy Wojciechowicz (So., Racine, Wis./Kenosha-Bradford, 83.0), Drew Lockerby (Sr., Waukesha, Wis./North, 84.5), Nick Vranes (So., Greendale, Wis., 85.0), Andrew McCarty (So., Geneva, Ill., 86.8) and Craig Mertes (Sr., Appleton, Wis./North, 92.0).

Top newcomers include Joey Johnston (Fr., Elk Grove Village, Ill./Guerin Prep, a three-time All-Chicago Catholic League honoree), Brendon Jones (Fr., St. Charles, Ill./West Chicago, All-DuPage Valley Conference and a sectional qualifier), David Niemiec (Fr., Chicago, Ill./Lane Tech, state qualifier and a top-10 finisher in nine tournaments), Dan Parks (Fr., Mount Prospect, Ill./Arlington Heights-Hersey, All-Mid-Suburban League), Garrett Peterson (Fr., Woodstock, Ill., All-Fox Valley Conference and *Northwest Herald* all-area), Kenny Rudy (Fr., Rockton, Ill./Hononegah, All-Northern Illinois Conference 10), Scott Shiple (Fr., Frankfort, Ill./Lincoln-Way East, All-Southwest Suburban Conference) and Jon Wengel (Fr., Fredonia, Wis./Ozaukee, All-Central Lakeshore Conference and a sectional qualifier).

## Robert Bonn Director of Athletics

Robert Bonn serves as director of athletics and as department chair for exercise and sport science within the division of education. Bonn, who begins his

17th year at Carthage in 2008-09, came from Pacific University in April 1992 where he served as head men's basketball coach, athletics director and chair of the department of physical education during his eight-year tenure. Prior to that, Bonn was an assistant men's basketball coach at both Western New Mexico University and at Framingham State College and head coach for boys basketball and baseball at Westwood High School in Massachusetts.

Under Bonn's leadership, the Carthage athletic program has become nationally recognized and respected based on significant improvements in facilities, fund raising, coaching expertise, team success and athletes. Athletic participation includes almost 30 percent of the undergraduate student body, with over 600 students involved in 24 NCAA intercollegiate sports (12 men, 12 women). Five sports have been added during Bonn's tenure: men's and women's soccer, women's golf, men's volleyball and women's water polo. He will start intercollegiate lacrosse at Carthage, with the men's team beginning in the spring of 2009 and the women's team starting in 2010. In the past 15 years, Carthage teams have won 52 College of Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin championships and 13 NCAA regional championships in 15 different sports.

Bonn earned a bachelor's degree in physical education and health from the University of Connecticut in 1974 where he lettered in baseball and lacrosse. He was a member of the Connecticut baseball team that played in the 1972 College World Series and was named lacrosse defensive player of the year for the 1974 squad. He received his master's degree from Springfield College in 1975 and his doctorate in education, with an emphasis in sport psychology and sociology from Boston University in 1983.

Bonn serves on the NCAA Region 4 Postgraduate Scholarship Committee and the Kenosha United Way Cabinet. He is a company leader for the

American Heart Association Southeastern Wisconsin "heart walk" and a member of the Kenosha Junior Achievement Board of Directors. In Kenosha County, he serves on the selection committee for the Holy Rosary "Sports Night High School Athletes of the Year." Bonn is a past president of the National Association of Athletic Development Directors (NAADD), a former member of the NCAA Division III Nominating Committee and a former member of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) executive committee. He was inducted into the Rockland High School (Massachusetts) Athletic Hall of Fame in 2005, where he was a three-sport athlete in football, basketball and baseball. Bonn was named GeneralSports TURF Systems "Division III West Region Athletic Director of the Year" in 2007 by NACDA for his accomplishments at Carthage.



## Steve Marovich Assistant Athletics Director/ Sports Information Director

Steve Marovich begins his 15th year as Carthage's sports information director in 2008-09. A native of Kalamazoo, Mich., Marovich received his bachelor's in political science from the University of Michigan in 1975 and a master's in athletic administration from Western Michigan University in 1990. He was a graduate assistant sports information director at Western Michigan from 1987-89 before becoming the sports information director at Nazareth College in Kalamazoo in 1989 and subsequently a co-director of the Nazareth Sports Center from 1991 to 1992. Following a stint as public relations director for the Kalamazoo Center for Independent Living from 1992 to 1994, Marovich arrived at Carthage for the 1994-95 academic year. Since 2002, he has also served as Carthage's assistant athletic director. Marovich and the Carthage communications team have received 88 publication awards from the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) since 1997, and he is a current member of the CoSIDA Publications Committee. Marovich and his wife, Melissa, live in Kenosha, Wis.

# Historical Review

## Carthage's Home Golf Courses

The Carthage men's golf squad rotates its practice and home events among six Kenosha-area courses.

- *Brighton Dale Links in Kansasville, Wis.*  
A public course operated by Kenosha County, Brighton Dale was ranked by the *Milwaukee Journal-Sentinel* as the state's 25th-best public course out of 420 courses in a 1997 survey. The facility's 18-hole White Birch tract was recognized by *Golf Digest* as a "Three-Star Award Winner" in both 1996 and 1997, and *Par Excellence Golf Magazine* cited White Birch's fifth hole as one of the "New Mean Midwest 18 Holes," noting the "ruthless nature" of the intimidating, 424-yard, par-four layout. Brighton Dale features three separate tracts, including the 6,900-yard White Birch course, the 6,600-yard Blue Spruce course and the nine-hole, 3,500-yard Red Pine course.



- *Bristol Oaks Country Club in Bristol, Wis.*  
A private course located on Wisconsin Highway 75 west of Kenosha, Wis., the Bristol Oaks Country Club features the 6,431-yard "Blue" course spread over gently rolling terrain and surrounded by mature trees.
- *Kenosha Country Club in Somers, Wis.*  
A private course located just off Kenosha County Road A in Somers, Wis., the Kenosha Country Club was founded in 1898 on Kenosha's south side but relocated to the northeast corner of Kenosha County in 1920. Donald J. Ross, the designer of the Pinehurst, N.C. course and the Oakland Hills Country Club in Bloomfield Hills, Mich., created the Kenosha Country Club course in 1922. The 6,511-yard "Blue" course is surrounded by mature trees with the Pike River winding throughout the facility.



- *Maplecrest Country Club in Kenosha, Wis.*  
Located at 9401 18th Street (Kenosha County Highway L) in Kenosha, Wis., the public Maplecrest Country Club opened in 1929 and was designed by Leonard Macomber. The "Maplecrest" course is a 6,411-yard facility.



- *The Club at Strawberry Creek in Kenosha, Wis.*  
A private course with limited public access, The Club at Strawberry Creek is located on Wisconsin Highway 50, two miles west of I-94 in Kenosha, Wis., and its co-developer is former Chicago Bears All-Pro center Jay Hilgenberg. The 7,113-yard "Black" course, designed by Rick Jacobson, features sweeping expanses of open space, native grasses that emulate Wisconsin's prairie landscape, sod-faced bunkers and fairway chipping areas. A natural wildlife habitat frames the final four holes.
- *Thunderhawk Golf Club in Beach Park, Ill.*  
Located on Lewis Avenue in Beach Park, Ill., the Thunderhawk Golf Club was designed by Robert Trent Jones Jr. and opened in 1999 as a public course. The "Championship" course measures 7,031 yards.

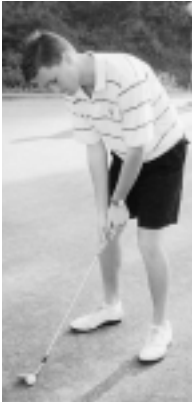

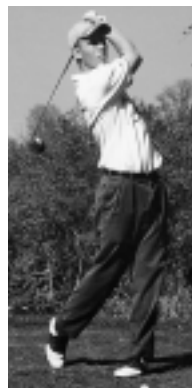
