## The Carthage Red Men/Lady Reds

Carthage men's athletic teams have carried the nickname "Red Men" since the 1920s. Referring to the color of their uniforms, the Red Men had no association with Native American imagery in those years, nor is there any today. With the rise of women's intercollegiate athletics in the late twentieth century, the teams chose the nickname "Lady Reds" in the 1980s. Again, that name referred to Carthage athletic colors. Flame imagery characterizes both academic and athletic identity at Carthage. The crest of the College features a torch and flame, and the highest award conferred by the College is the "Carthage Flame." The athletic logotypes for the Red Men and the Lady Reds feature a stylized flame symbolizing heat, fire, and commitment.

# Carthage Men's Lacrosse 2009 Season Preview

Carthage College adds its 23rd varsity sport in 2009, as the men's lacrosse team begins its first year of varsity competition. Women's lacrosse will begin in 2010. Head coach David Neff has been on board at Carthage since September 2007, recruiting for both teams, and he will coach the men's team. The Red Men will play a 16-game schedule in 2009, including 11 games against NCAA Division III opponents, three against NCAA Division I club teams and two against NAIA teams.

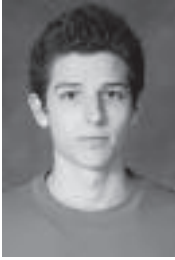

In the past 15 years, Carthage teams have won 52 College of Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin championships

He was a member of the Connecticut baseball team that played in the 1972 College World Series and was named lacrosse defensive player of the year for the 1974 squad. He was inducted into the Rockland High School (Massachusetts) Athletic Hall of Fame in 2005, where he was a three-sport athlete in football, basketball and baseball. Bonn was named GeneralSports TURF Systems "Division III West Region Athletic Director of the Year" in 2007 by NACDA for his accomplishments at Carthage.

## Directions to Carthage College

**From northbound I-94:** Exit at Wisconsin Highway 50, Wisconsin Highway 158 or Wisconsin Highway 142. Follow east for approximately eight miles and turn left (north) at Sheridan Road (Wisconsin Highway 32). Just past St. Catherine Commons senior living, Sheridan Road becomes, by going straight at the light, Alford Park Drive and follows Lake Michigan. Carthage College and Art Keller Field are on Alford Park Drive, less than a mile north of St. Catherine Commons. Please note that in early 2005, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation will begin a three-year reconstruction project for Wisconsin Highway 32, which includes the stretch of Alford Park Drive alongside the Carthage campus. During the first phase of construction, which should be completed by September 2005, Alford Park Drive will be closed in both directions between St. Catherine Commons and the Carthage campus. To reach campus from northbound Sheridan Road, turn left at old Sheridan Road (Mexican restaurant on the corner). Go past a cemetery on the right and a convenience store on the left. Old Sheridan Road will dead end at Alford Park Drive at the north end of campus. Turn right and then make an immediate left onto Campus Drive. Follow Campus Drive up the hill and to the right around campus to reach the Tarble Arena.

**From southbound I-94:** Exit at Highway E, the first Kenosha exit. Follow east for approximately eight miles, or until the road ends at Sheridan Road (Wisconsin Highway 32) and turn right (south). Carthage College is on this road, approximately one mile south of Highway E. Turn left at Campus Drive and follow Campus Drive up the hill and to the right around campus to reach the Tarble Arena.

To reach the college, follow the Indiana, Ohio and Pennsylvania Turnpikes. Exit the Pennsylvania Turnpike at Fort Washington (exit 339). Follow Route 309 north and turn left at Norristown Road in Spring House. The college is two miles ahead on the right.

### **March 7-8 at Fontbonne and**

**Lindenwood:** Fontbonne University plays its home lacrosse games at Gay Field, near its campus in St. Louis, Mo.,. To reach that facility, follow I-294 around Chicago, Ill. Exit I-294 at I-55 south toward St. Louis, Mo. Follow I-55 across the Mississippi River into St. Louis and take I-64/U.S. 40 west of downtown. Exit I-64/U.S. 40 at Clayton Road. Turn right (north) at South Big Bend Boulevard and turn left at Wydown Boulevard. Turn right at Hanley Road. Turn left at Maryland Avenue, which becomes Ladue Road. Turn right at Gay Avenue to reach the field. To reach Lindenwood University, located in St. Charles, Mo., from Fontbonne, return to I-64 and go west. Exit I-64 at I-270 north. Exit I-270 at I-70 west. Exit I-70 at Missouri Highway 94 east, which becomes First Capitol. Turn left at Kings Highway and Lindenwood is on the left. Follow the drive to other end of campus, the athletic complex and Harlen C. Hunter Stadium.
