The Carthage Red Men/Lady Reds

Carthage men's athletic teams have carried the nickname "Red Men" since the 1920s. Referring to the color of their uniforms, the Red Men had no association with Native American imagery in those years, nor is there any today.

With the rise of women's intercollegiate athletics in the late twentieth century, the teams chose the nickname "Lady Reds" in the 1980s. Again, that name referred to Carthage athletic colors.

Flame imagery characterizes both academic and athletic identity at Carthage. The crest of the College features a torch and flame, and the highest award conferred by the College is the "Carthage Flame." The athletic logotypes for the Red Men and the Lady Reds feature a stylized flame symbolizing heat, fire, and commitment.

2008 Carthage Men's Soccer Review/ 2009 Season Outlook

2008 Season Review

An outstanding late-season effort propelled the 2008 Carthage College men's Soccer team (10-6-5, 5-1-1 College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin) to the verge of winning the league's automatic qualifier to the NCAA Division III Men's Soccer Championship. Guided by coach Steve Domin (138-107-23, 14 years), the Red Men played 220 minutes of conference-tournament soccer without allowing a goal but also went 220 minutes without scoring a goal, ending the season with five ties.

The Red Men, who finished second in the regular-season conference standings with a 5-1-1 mark, played Illinois Wesleyan University to a 0-0 tie in double-overtime in the tournament semifinals. Carthage won the regular-season game over IWU, 4-0. The Red Men advanced to the tournament-championship game, 5-3, on penalty kicks, while conference-champion Wheaton College (Ill.) defeated North Park University, 4-2, in the other semifinal contest.

In the tournament-championship game at Wheaton's Joe Bean Stadium, the Red Men and the Thunder played two scoreless periods and two more scoreless overtime periods for a tie. Carthage claimed a share of the tournament championship with the decision, but Wheaton (Ill.) was awarded the automatic qualifier, 4-3, on penalty kicks. Carthage, which went 6-1-3 over its final 10 games, did not receive an at-large berth in the NCAA championship. The Red Men won the 2007 league title and made its first-ever post-season appearance.

En route to the conference tournament, Carthage went 5-1-1 in regular-season CCIW play. The Red Men lost to North Park, 2-1 in the final seconds, on Oct. 1, despite out-shooting the Vikings, 16-13. Carthage played Wheaton (Ill.) to a 3-3 tie in double-overtime on Oct. 15. The Red Men opened the season with a split at the Buena Vista University Classic, defeating the host-Beavers but losing to NAIA Northwestern College (Iowa). The following weekend, Carthage played host to its own "Battle on the Border" tournament at Art Keller Field. The Red Men tied Viterbo University and lost to Loras College for the tournament championship. Carthage went 4-3-3 in its other non-conference games and finished the regular season ranked eighth in the NCAA Division III Central Region poll.

Three members of the Carthage squad were named to the 2008 All-CCIW team. Goalkeeper Andy Connor (graduated-senior., Lake Zurich, Ill./Mundelein-Carmel Catholic, 1.00 goals-against average, 8 shutouts), midfielder Chris Fidlow (graduated-senior, Gurnee, Ill./Mundelein-Carmel Catholic, 7 goals, 6 assists) and forward Tyler Cortez (So., Naperville, Ill./North) were named second-team All-CCIW. Connor and Fidlow were also named second-team all-conference in both 2006 and 2007. Connor was named National Soccer Coaches Association of America second-team all-region and first-team All-Wisconsin, while Fidlow earned second-team all-state honors.

2009 Season Outlook

Coach Steve Domin returns 13-of-27 letterwinners and six-of-11 starters from last year's 10-6-5 team. Lost to graduation were second-team All-CCIW goalkeeper Andy Connor, second-team all-conference midfielder Chris Fidlow and fellow starters Gary Mouradian (Antioch, Ill., 3 goals, 1 assist), Joey Monegato (Elk Grove Village, Ill./Elk Grove, 2 goals) and Greg Swift (Rockford, Ill./Boylan Central Catholic).

Second-team All-CCIW forward Tyler Cortez leads the returnees, along with midfielder Andrew Gamarra (Sr., Lexington, Ky./Wisconsin-Parkside, 3 goals, 2 assists), defender Jordan Baker (So., Lisle, Ill./Naperville-North, 1 goal, 2 assists), midfielder/forward Tyler Peterson (Sr., New Berlin, Wis./Eisenhower/Northern Illinois University, 1 goal), forward/defender Aleks Urosecic (So., Skokie, Ill./Wilmette-Loyola Academy), forward Josh Khoshbin (Jr., Hawthorn Woods, Ill./Lake Zurich/Beloit College, 2 goals, 2 assists) defender Zak Khoshbin (So., Hawthorn Woods, Ill./Lake Zurich). "We lost some key pieces to graduation," admits Domin. "We'll be incredibly young this year and building toward the future."

Leading newcomers include midfielder Cesar Castanon (Fr., Des Plaines, Ill./Park Ridge-Maine East, Pioneer Press all-area), defender/forward Jordan Innis (Fr., Lake in the Hills, Ill./Crystal Lake-South, Illinois High School Soccer Coaches Association all-sectional), midfielder Drew Liogas (Fr., Gurnee, Ill./Warren Township, Daily Herald all-area), forward/midfielder Kosta Minchev (Fr., Skokie, Ill./Niles North, Illinois High School Soccer Coaches Association all-

sectional), goalkeeper Taao Scarnato (Fr., Lake Zurich, Ill., Illinois High School Soccer Coaches Association all-state) and defender/midfielder Will Veliz (Fr., Springfield, Ill./Glenwood, Illinois High School Soccer Coaches Association all-sectional).

Carthage opens its 2009 season by playing at NCAA Division II Rollins College on the Red Men's annual season-opening trip. Carthage plays host to its "Battle on the Border" Tournament on Sept. 4-6, taking on Viterbo University and Clarke College. Other 2009 non-conference opponents include Concordia University (Wis.), St. Olaf College, Carleton College, Robert Morris University (Ill.), Cardinal Stritch University, the University of Dubuque, Finlandia University and St. John's College (Minn.).

"As always," says Domin, "we are only interested in playing the best-possible teams. We'll be competitive, even with a difficult schedule. I'm not 100 percent certain we'll see all of the results that we're accustomed to, but we'll find an identity and a style as we go."

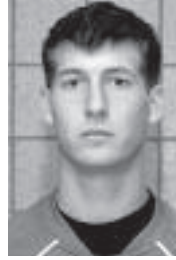

He also had a four-year playing career for the Carthage baseball team. A two-year team captain, he compiled a .322 career batting

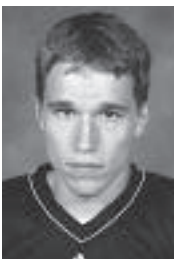

Five sports have been added during Bonn's tenure: men's and women's soccer, women's golf, men's volleyball and women's water polo. He will start intercollegiate lacrosse at Carthage, with the men's team beginning in the spring of 2009 and the women's team starting in 2010. In the past 15 years, Carthage teams have won 52 College of Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin championships and 13 NCAA regional championships in 15 different sports.

Bonn earned a bachelor's degree in physical education and health from the University of Connecticut in 1974 where he lettered in baseball and lacrosse. He was a member of the Connecticut baseball team that played in the 1972 College World Series and was named lacrosse defensive player of the year for the 1974 squad. He received his master's degree from Springfield College in 1975 and his doctorate in education, with an emphasis in sport psychology and sociology from Boston University in 1983.

Bonn serves on the NCAA Region 4 Postgraduate Scholarship Committee and the Kenosha United Way Cabinet. He is a company leader for the American Heart Association Southeastern

Wisconsin "heart walk" and a member of the Kenosha Junior Achievement Board of Directors. In Kenosha County, he serves on the selection committee for the Holy Rosary "Sports Night High School Athletes of the Year." Carthage Soccer Facilities

Carthage's first home men's soccer game took place on Sept. 12, 1981 versus Maranatha Baptist Bible College. That game was played on a field near the site of today's football practice facility. The Carthage teams in the late-1980s played their home contests on the Harvey Glaess Memorial Soccer Field on the Carthage campus. That facility was located in the left- field portion of the Carthage Baseball Field. The baseball facility was fenced in during the early 1990s, putting an end to that on-campus soccer facility. When the men's varsity program was re-instated in 1995 and women's soccer added, both teams moved to Art Keller Field.

Art Keller Field, originally known as the Carthage Football Field, was dedicated on Sept. 24, 1966 prior to a game versus Lake Forest College. In its original configuration, with wooden bleachers on both sides of the field, the facility had 4,000 seats. In November 1975, the Carthage Board of Trustees named the facility the Art Keller Athletic Field, and the name was shortened to Art Keller Field in 2004.

The wooden bleachers on the home side of the field (west) were removed prior to the 1996 season and were replaced by all-new metal and molded-plastic bleacher seating for 986 fans. At the same time, the press box was moved from the west side of the field to east side, adjacent to the W.A. Seidemann Natatorium. Lights were added in 1997, and a portion of the wooden bleachers on the visitor's side of the field were removed prior to the 2002 season. In its current configuration, the Art Keller Field is a 1,658-seat facility.

In 2000, thanks to a major gift from David and Gael Romoser, parents of former Carthage women's soccer player Lisa Romoser, a state-of-the-art AstroPlay, surface was installed on Art Keller Field. That surface was replaced in 2008 with FieldTurf,. Both products are synthetic surfaces consisting of soft, low-abrasion nylon fibers surrounded by rubber granules. Installed over a sophisticated drainage system, the surface offers excellent traction regardless of weather, and can accommodate intensive use in a succession of games and practice sessions. Art Keller Field was one of the country's first installations of this technology, now spreading rapidly in professional and NCAA ranks.

A soccer practice field, with natural grass, is located just west of Art Keller Field. In 2002, Carthage added World Cup-style shelters for both benches and the scorer's table. In the summer of 2005, a new press box was constructed on the east side of the field. That press facility will allow Carthage to play host to NCAA Division III Men's and Women's Soccer Championship events. An enclosed end line netting system was installed for each goal in 2008.

Year-by-Year Records

The Carthage men's soccer program traces its beginnings to 1967 when German professor Guenter Pfister launched an unofficial Carthage club team that played on campus, near the site of today's football practice field. Pfister left the faculty in 1968, and Randy Sisulak, a player on the team, guided the squad for the next three seasons. Sisulak would later become the father of Erich Sisulak, who played on the 2000-03 Carthage men's teams. One of the highlights of that early period was a 1-1 tie with Northwestern University. Masato Mizuno, '70, a former member of the Carthage Board of Trustees, was a member of that first team.

Carthage granted official club status to the team in 1971, with mathematics professor Harvey Glaess taking over coaching responsibilities. The program first gained varsity status in 1981 with Glaess remaining as head coach. John Bocwinski, a member of the U.S. Olympic soccer team in 1972, took over from Glaess beginning in 1984. From 1981-83, the Redmen played in the Wisconsin Collegiate Soccer Conference, along with Gateway Technical Institute, Holy Redeemer College, Maranatha Baptist Bible College, Milwaukee Area Technical College, Northwestern College and the Waukesha County Technical Institute. Carthage's 1982 team was actually a coed squad, with Lori Vogt, Lori Bowie and Sherri Berg members of the team.



Varsity play continued through the 1986 season before reverting to club status in the late 1980s and early 1990s. The Carthage teams in the late-1980s played their home contests on the Harvey Glaess Memorial Soccer Field on the Carthage campus. That facility was located in the left-field portion of the Carthage Baseball Field. The baseball facility was fenced in during the early 1990s, putting an end to the on-campus soccer facility.

2009 CCIW MEN'S SOCCER TOURNAMENT

The CCIW plays a post-season tournament to determine its automatic qualifier to the NCAA Division III Men's Soccer Championship. The top-four teams, by CCIW-championship points, qualify for the CCIW Men's Soccer Tournament, with each team receiving three points for a regular-season conference win, one point for a tie and no points for a loss.

The top-two seeds will play host to semifinal games on Nov. 4, 2009. In even years, if either host-school has earned the right to play host to semifinal matches in both men's and women's soccer, then the women's game involving that school only will be played on the previous day. In odd years, that same conflict would require the men's game to be played on the previous day. This would only apply to the schools where there is a conflict. The highest-remaining seed in the tournament, following the semifinals, will play host to the championship game on Nov. 7, 2009, with that winner securing the automatic qualifier. In the event of a tie in a tournament game, penalty kicks will only determine which team advances to or wins the tournament-championship game.

The College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin

Now in its 64th year, as of 2009-10, the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league, with nine charter members, was formed on April 26, 1946, in Jacksonville, Ill., and opened competition in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois. The nine charter members were Augustana College (Ill.), Carthage College, Elmhurst College, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan University, Lake Forest College, Millikin University, North Central College and Wheaton College (Ill.) Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967, the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin, to recognize Carthage, which moved to Kenosha, Wis., in 1962, and Carroll College (Wis.), which entered the conference in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced several changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton withdrew following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll (Wis.) joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in the fall of 1961, and North Park College (now North Park University) entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll (Wis.) withdrew. Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence.

In NCAA competition, CCIW schools have accounted for 39 national

championships, including 18 for North Central (12 in men's cross country, four in men's outdoor track and field, one in men's indoor track and field and one in women's basketball), six by Wheaton (Ill., three in women's soccer, two in men's soccer and one in men's basketball, the latter a 1957 NCAA College Division title), five by North Park in men's basketball, four by Augustana (Ill.) in football, three by Illinois Wesleyan University (one each in men's basketball, women's indoor track and field and women's outdoor track and field), two by Elmhurst in women's volleyball and one by Millikin University in women's basketball.

The CCIW sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track and field, men's and women's outdoor track and field, volleyball and wrestling. Carthage has claimed 74 conference titles, including 14 in baseball, nine in football, seven in men's golf, seven each in men's tennis and women's volleyball, five in women's indoor track and field, four each in men's basketball, women's golf and women's tennis, three each in men's cross country, men's swimming and women's outdoor track and field and one each in men's soccer, women's soccer, women's basketball and softball.

The CCIW first sponsored men's soccer as a championship sport in 1988, and Wheaton (Ill.) has won a league-leading 15 titles. The Thunder have claimed the title all but six times. North Central won league championships in 1991 and 1994, North Park won the 2004-06 titles, and Carthage won the 2007 championship. Wheaton (Ill.) and Millikin each claimed a co-championship in 2001, and Wheaton (Ill.) shared the 2002 title with Augustana (Ill.).

The CCIW determines its men's soccer championship by points, with each team receiving three points for a regular-season conference win, one point for a tie and no points for a loss. The conference plays a post-season tournament to determine its automatic qualifier to the NCAA Division III Men's Soccer Championship. The top-four teams, by CCIW-championship points, qualify for the CCIW Men's Soccer Tournament.

The top-two seeds will play host to semifinal games on Nov. 4, 2009. In even years, if either host-school has earned the right to play host to semifinal matches in both men's and women's soccer, then the women's game involving that school only will be played on the previous day. In odd years, that same conflict would require the men's game to be played on the previous day. This would only apply to the schools where there is a conflict. The highest-remaining seed in the tournament, following the semifinals, will play host to the championship game on Nov. 7, 2009, with that winner securing the automatic qualifier. In the event of a tie in a tournament game, penalty kicks will only determine which team advances to or wins the tournament-championship game.
