
Writing Body Paragraphs

ESSENTIAL COMPONENTS FOR THE "HEART" OF YOUR PAPER




1.) TRANSITION SENTENCE

-Leads from previous idea into the main idea for this paragraph -Can also be placed at the end of the previous paragraph

2.) TOPIC SENTENCE

-States the main idea of the paragraph -Main idea: one supporting idea of the paper that relates to your thesis





3.) EVIDENCE

-Quote, fact, or statistic that helps prove your main idea -Also include explanation of the context for the piece of evidence

4.) ANALYSIS

-Further explanation of your evidence -How does it support the main idea? -How does your main idea relate back to your thesis?



ORDERING YOUR PARAGRAPHS:

-Start with the strongest or most relevant idea/evidence -Next, go to any weaker points (like ones with less support) -Put your second strongest idea last, right before your conclusion

-Don't want to end on an unconvincing paragraph

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
