3. Nathan: Not a discussion on whether or not we like cameras, it's more about whether or not we need a resolution
4. Tyler: Talked to some folks around campus. Dr. Hancock thought we should do everything we can to maximize the number of cameras. Thought that telling students where cameras are means they can be avoided by students. Professor Minsky-Kelly says that students who have hate crimes committed against them have to front the charge
5. Natasha: Overwhelming response against cameras pointing *toward* the bathrooms. Cameras in hallways and stairwells, but none toward the bathrooms
6. Daniel: What proves a successful pilot test?
  - a. Nathan: The goal of cameras is to reduce violence, harassment, and vandalism. If cameras across the board don't do that at all, then cameras need to be rethought.
7. Emily: Important that public safety and administration put out a statement on how the cameras are going to be used. Are students going to be informed of a camera being looked at?
8. Tyler: Do we think that this 2-5 camera pilot is enough of an implementation of cameras? Or do we need more
9. Katherine P: Not sure the 2-5 is an accurate sample size. Not enough for an accurate interpretation of if this will work. Write a resolution to increase the pilot size.
10. Katherine R: The small amount is not as sufficient as we think it is. Maybe fake cameras in other places? What about the people who don't have cameras? In a resolution, there needs to be guidelines of how public safety is going to be using them.
11. Phil: Consensus is that cameras are important. Especially with a gender inclusive floor. Ask for a plan of where the cameras are going to be placed and communication of usage. Need more than just the sample size. Collect ideas to help draft the resolution
12. Emily to Nick: Do we know if the cameras will go on the gender inclusive housing floor?
  - a. Nick: this is a priority location
13. Dom: Would cameras be in the same dorm or different ones?
  - a. Nick: Looking to spread them out into areas of concern.
